NOTES from Pastor Randy...

During my recent D.Min class at American Seminary, I had the privilege to meet and interact with Rev. Dr. Larron Jackson.

Dr. Jackson has a very interesting and exciting story which he recalls in his autobiography, The Ghetto, the Gridiron and the Gospel. Larron grew up in the intercity of St. Louis (the Ghetto), he became a successful high school, college, and professional player (the Gridiron), and then became a minister and pastor when God led him into pastoral ministry (the Gospel).

In recounting his life, Larron did not have it easy. He grew up in a home filled with alcohol and domestic violence. He suffered through racial discrimination as a black man in the 1950's and 60's.

In spite of all he has been through, he is able to conclude, "My life has been a journey in God's grace. While I was not always aware of it, that phrase points to the many ways in which God made real His power and presence throughout my life...As I talked about the circumstances of my birth, the pain and chaos of growing up in the midst of alcoholism, domestic violence, and physical and mental abuse, it has been my hope that the reader would see God's presence despite the circumstances of my life."

I wonder how many of us would have that same kind of attitude if we had experienced Larron's life.

God's grace is at work in our lives in ways we may never understand this side of heaven. When it doesn't seem like I am experiencing grace, that is probably the time I am experiencing grace the most.

Larron concludes his book by writing, "I trust and believe that wherever God is leading me, He will continue to make real His power, presence and grace in my life to do what He would have me to do. I further trust and believe God will be with me every step of the way. Through my faith in the sufficiency of God's grace, I am convinced God has equipped me with what I need to finish strong as I run this race to His honor and glory."

All I can say is "Amen, Dr. Jackson. Amen!"


Please note the date for the Annual Reports meeting is scheduled for Sunday February 5 after the service.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Last month I quoted an article from Outreach Magazine and finished my article with a question, "How can you/I do the same at Grace?" Do WHAT? Be a neighbor by showing God's love and mercy as in Matthew 10:25-37. We can develop relationships with people so we get to know them, and they get to know us, so they can see we are living proof of God's Love. At some point, relationship will allow us to share with them how they can experience the same love they have seen at work in our lives! We are salt and light. *Matthew 5:16* records Jesus saying, "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." You and I have God in us and the GOOD NEWS that should be proclaimed and demonstrated by us, His children, just as the angels announced it to the shepherds. Evangelism, sharing the GOOD NEWS, seems to have been replaced by Conversionism, "focusing on the atonement component available through Christ" (are you saved?)...The difference in Conversionism and Evangelism is summed up well in something Dallas Willard said: "I'm not trying to get people to heaven after they die. I'm trying to get them there while they're still alive." (Outreach Magazine) The point is the purpose of demonstrating and proclaiming the GOOD NEWS of Jesus is to bring life to others NOW, not just so they can be "saved and go to heaven." Focusing on Conversionism warps our sense of Evangelism as Christians. Be salt and light in an attractive way!

MUM OPEN HEARTS PANTRY

Montavilla Methodist Open Heart Pantry was kept busy during the freezing weather and ice in December. The usual families came as well as many homeless. Their need for food was met. Thank you to all who donate.

Seth Young is continuing to go to Sunshine division for 500 - 700 pounds of food for the pantry! In December they received a donation of Frozen Turkey Breasts for families right before Christmas; and this was most welcomed. The date for this particular pick up is either the first or second Tuesday of the month. If you are able to help with unloading and shelving the Tuesday pick-ups, please let Barbra Furman or Seth know. The time for pick up is around noon and would take less than an hour.

A donation from a member of Montavilla Methodist Church is enabling the pantry to purchase some newer shelving to replace older and less useful shelving units.

With donations through Sunshine Division, the shelves are well stocked. Still in need are the easily consumed food from a carton for the homeless; household and personal cleaning items, such as laundry soap, and general cleaning items; and personal items, such as bar soap, shampoo, and toothpaste. Food programs are not able to supply these important items.



Heads up as they want to schedule a cleaning day for the storage rooms. Time for this will be forthcoming.

Time for Friday shelving food is now at 10:30 am on the Friday of distribution. Next scheduled days are Friday, February 17 and Saturday, February 18
