Pastor Randy's Notes

(The following article is an excerpt from *Lies We Believe About God* by William Paul Young)

Let us be unequivocally clear: there is nothing good about a cross. It was devised as a torture machine to implement the most profound humiliation and abuse. Its purpose was solely to keep a human being alive as long as possible and in as much pain as possible until his very breath (spirit) was violently ripped from his body through excruciating suffocation. The point of eventually breaking the legs was to speed the process so the executioners could go home to waiting meals and families.

Who originated the Cross?

If God did, then we worship a cosmic abuser, who in Divine Wisdom created a means to torture human beings in the most painful and abhorrent manner. Frankly, it is often this very cruel and monstrous god that the atheist refuses to acknowledge or grant credibility in any sense. And rightly so. Better no god at all, than this one.

The alternative is the Cross originated with us human beings. This deviant device is the iconic manifestation of our blind commitment to darkness. It is our ultimate desecration of the goodness and loving intent of God to create, an intent that is focused on the human creation. It is the ultimate fist raised against God.

And how did God respond to this profound brokenness?

God submitted to it. God climbed willingly onto our torture device and met us at the deepest and darkest place of our diabolical imprisonment to our own lies, and by submitting once and for all, God destroyed its power. Jesus is God's best, given willingly and in opposition to our worst, the Cross.

When did God submit? Not only in Jesus incarnate but before the creation of the world, according to Scriptures (Revelation 13:8). God knew going into the activity of creation what the cost would be. That God's own children, this highest order of creation, would one day make the final attempt to kill Life...

And while evil is never justified, it is redeemed and rescued from its intent, thus becoming a statement of true justice.


This is Jesus. God submitting to our torture machine and transforming it into an icon and monument of grace, so precious to us that we wear it on our rings or around our necks. This torture device declares that there is nothing I can bring to the table that is so evil or broken that God won't climb into it with me. There is nothing so dead that God is incapable of growing in it something living. The Cross, once our greatest attempt at destroying Life, has become our most precious symbol of the God who is hope for us all.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

As I wrote in my September article, it seems our business is the Father's business– the business of producing fruit for the kingdom of God.

In my devotional reading, 40 Days with Jesus, which follows the gospel of Luke, my attention was caught by Chapter 8's Parable of the Sower. After telling the parable, Jesus called out, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear." The disciples evidently didn't understand so they asked him what it meant. Verse 11 begins with, "This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God." In verse 15 he ends his parable explanation with, "But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce fruit."

Now read and compare John 1:8&9 to Luke 8:16 where Jesus continues, "No one lights a lamp and hides it in a jar or puts it under a bed. Instead, he puts it on a stand, so that those who come in can see the light." It appears Jesus wants us to be seen (for the right reasons) so people can see the light in the dark. After Jesus physically left this world we became his light in the world because he lives within us. Persevering is a key element to producing fruit and we have to keep going! Praise God in all things!

GLEN AND RITA CHAPMAN

Come have dinner with Glen and Rita Chapman in the Fellowship Hall on Thursday, October 19, 2017, at 6:30 pm. Please RSVP on the sign-up sheet on the table in the entryway.

Glen and Rita Chapman are American Baptist Missionaries working in the Republic of the Congo. They have a four prong ministry- Theological Education, Discipleship, Education and Economic Development. They have been instrumental in upgrading the Kikongo pastoral training school to a university level with three majors: Theology, Agriculture and Teacher Training. Glen is the Academic Dean and teaches: Old Testament, Hebrew, and Baptist Distinctives. Rita maintains the library, teaches English, and works with the wives of the theology students.



Glen uses a Powered parachute for transporting audiovisual equipment to remote villages where he presents evangelism, conservation, and health seminars. They have been involved in raising animals and introducing beekeeping to agricultural training.

Glen writes "Our vision here is to train men and women of integrity who will be able to build the nation in a rural environment. So much land is falling into chaos and deeper poverty because of ignorance and sorcery. We see excitement in our new students and a thirst for knowledge. They are hungry for a firm Biblical foundation. They seek skills that lead to employment and values that are foundational for good management of the community, environment, and managing land in a responsible and sustainable way."

Although no decisions have been made as to what will be funded with the bulk of the money, the Board has determined how Grace will tithe this portion of the funds: 10% will go to Camp Arrah Wanna and 10% will go to One Great Hour of Sharing for Hurricane Relief.
