NOTES FROM THE BOARD

One of the things the Board is responsible for is our church finances. We monitor our finances every month and have been paying especially close attention in 2018. Each month we provide a financial report to the congregation in the newsletter. We thought it would be good to provide a summary of what has been happening with our finances during the first five months of this year.

As you can see from these figures there is a pattern of income being less than expenses with the resultant drop in our General Fund balance. If this pattern continues, it appears that the General Fund will be depleted before the end of the year.

In order to be sure that we are able to meet all of our expenses through 2018, the Board has made the decision to use up to \$20,000 of Atkinson Fund money, if necessary, to shore up the General Fund. If the General Fund balance less payroll liabilities drops to \$1,000 in any month where income is less than expenses, money will be transferred from the Atkinson Fund to the General Fund to cover the shortfall.

That takes care of 2018, but raises the question about what we do in 2019. The Board has scheduled a meeting in July to talk about God's plan for Grace in the long term. After July we will gather as a church family to discuss ideas and recommendations that come out of the July Board meeting.

Please keep the church and our leadership in your prayers as we seek God's direction and move forward in action together to be the church He wants us to be.

MUMC'S OPEN HEARTS PANTRY

Exciting News at the Open Heart Pantry. We now have a Grace Baptist team to staff a third day for food distribution.

This will begin on Thursday, July 19. Two of our members have been to the Open Hearts Pantry for observation. Training of the new team members will be Thursday, July 12.

In celebration of this new event, we will declare July to be "Open Hearts Food Pantry Month" on Sunday, July 15. We will be introducing the team members from our church. There will be a discussion of this ministry and how we can be supportive. We would like each person or family to bring a jar (or more) of jam or jelly to be displayed in the entryway as a visible picture of our support.

The pantry has need of peanut butter and canned fruit. Non-food items are always in need such as personal care and cleaning items.

Shelving, formerly on Friday at 10:00 am, will now take place on the Thursdays of distribution week at 11:00 am. Our Grace team will oversee the pantry beginning on Thursday, July 19, 12:00-2:00 pm. The pantry is also open on Friday, July 20, 3:00 pm-5:00 pm, and Saturday, July 21, 9:00 am-12:00 noon will be overseen my MUMC's people.

Again, this year Grace will host a booth on Sunday, July 29, from 10:00 am-5:00 pm. Last year we handed out over 700 bottles of waters. Please sign up for a shift.

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Grace will continue to take the 2018 One Great Hour of Sharing Offering during the month of July. We responded in Puerto Rico when hurricanes Irma and Maria hit. Seminariao Evangelico suffered major damage to its student housing, chapel, library, trees and administration building. Immediately the school received an OGHS Emergency Disaster Response Grant to deal with student needs. OGHS funds will assist when volunteers begin work efforts at the school. They will also be part of 75 projects to be addressed by ABHMS multi-year "Rebuilding, Restoring, Renewing Puerto Rico" initiative.

OGHS partners with organizations worldwide to provide access to clean water to help eradicate disease and transform communities. In eastern Kenya, they supported the building of a sand dam. Before the dam, the Mbangulo people went hungry because they didn't have enough water to cook food. Children missed school because they needed to get water for their families. The task of fetching water took most of the day.

The local community provided local materials that were combined with construction materials provided by OGHS. Now children are in school. They have built new classrooms out of local brick. Food is more plentiful as water allows people to grow gardens and have more time to tend them.

International Ministries received a grant from OGHS to respond to the critical needs after the volcanic eruption in Guatemala last month. Over 1,701,956 people were affected when their villages were buried. The grant is being coordinated by Rev. Ricarda Maylo Bracero, who resides in Guatemala and is the IM Regional Consultant to Iberamerica and Caribbean.

After consulting with the Board of General Ministries, the Rev. Dr. Lee B. Spitzer, ABC USA General Secretary, has written a letter to Jeff Sessions in response to his remarks which cited Romans 13: 1-2 as justification for practices such as separating children from their parents in immigration cases. Dr. Spitzer states he wants to communicate "our ABC Churches' deep concern over unjust immigration policies of the United States government, and in particular, the unconscionable separation of children from their families at our southern border." He urges that compassion, fairness, and family-affirming policies need to characterize our response to the plight of families on our borders. He quoted *Romans* 13:10, "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law."

GRACE-FULL

As I write this article at the end of June, I want to reiterate what I wrote you in the January article in December 2017. I mentioned that the General Fund was in the black, and then the following: "However, we will need to monitor finances very closely in 2018 and the Board will have to simultaneously address our ministry goals and our financial situation. Our expenses have been at least \$2,000 over our income for both October and November and the December outlook is only slightly better. As your Lay Minister of Finance, I will be bringing the situation to the Board's attention."

Grace's financial situation has continued to slide in the past six months. Only in February when expenses were lower than usual, has there been more income than expenses in any month, and I do not anticipate anything different in the June report. I want to assure you that your Board is paying very close attention to the financial situation. In the quote above, I point out that the Board "will have to simultaneously address our ministry goals and our financial situation." The plan to do that "addressing" will continue with a Board retreat in July after Pastor Randy has returned.

We answer to you, the congregation/body of Grace Baptist Church, as your elected leadership and we are each in serious prayer "mode" for the future of Grace. Please undergird us with YOUR prayers.
