Pastor Randy's Notes

Hebrews 11 has a long list of God's faithful who serve as "a great cloud of witnesses" (Heb. 12:1)- Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses' parents, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, and Samuel. A new name needs to be added to that list- Seth Young.

With Seth's passing, there has been a lot of reflection on his life from many of us. Seth was as faithful as they come. He trusted God for everything. There were times that he admitted to me he didn't understand what God was doing, but his trust in God's grace, mercy, and provision never wavered.

Faith is easy to have when things are going well, and we can easily see God's blessings. Not so much when things are difficult. Faith becomes elusive as we get anxious and fearful. The thing about Seth is he trusted God in good times and bad.

I remember a story Seth told about the early days of starting Enoch Manufacturing. He had just started and finances were tight. There was a bill that was due, and he knew he couldn't pay it. I forget if it was rent, utilities, or something related to Enoch, but the money just wasn't there. Seth spent a lot of time talking to God about the shortfall, and trusted God would provide. Sure enough, the exact amount showed up in the mail from some source Seth didn't even know existed. That is living by faith.

Right now, our church is facing uncertain times- low numbers, sagging income, lack of clarity from God as to what the future holds. Now is not the time to become fearful and anxious. Now is not the time to try and fix things ourselves.

Now is the time to follow the example of all of those listed in Hebrews 11, and yes, to follow the example of Seth Young, and live by faith. Now is the time to trust God, pray, seek his wisdom, and wait for him to give us clarity in terms of what he wants us to do next.

WORLD MISSION OFFERING

You are the salt of the Earth Matthew 5:13

Grace Baptist will continue taking the World Mission Offering during the month of October. This offering goes to direct support of our International Ministries Missionaries. The theme this year is "You are the Salt of the Earth". We are urged to go into the whole world and enhance the good that Christ is doing so others can be touched by the power of the saving grace of God. The world fellowship offering allows us to come alongside 120 global servants and 240 global Christian partners. Together we work on abolishing global slavery, health and wellness, and economic and community development.

Meet Dr. Tim and Kathy Rice. The Rice's moved to Vanga in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) in 2015 to work in a rural village hospital on a short term mission. Kathy served as the head of the nursing school, educating 250 future nurses and midwives. They are currently learning French so they can serve



long term in contributing to the training of nursing and medical students for Christ-centered, whole person care, and utilizing limited resources available to increase community health in rural villages. Their desire is to facilitate worldwide partnerships, enabling health professionals to participate in mutual exchange of expertise at the Vanga Evangelical Hospital and elsewhere in the world. Tim is also on the faculty of School of Medicine at Saint Louis University.
