

As we leave 2018 behind and enter 2019, we leave behind a very chaotic year.

Like many of you, I am not very comfortable with chaos. I would rather have things more orderly—more predictable. Unfortunately that is not how life works most of the time.

Often life is messy, chaotic, and unpredictable. However, it is in that chaos that God does his best work.

Before God created the earth and the heavens, Genesis 1 tells us, "In the beginning...the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep..." My interpretation of this is "In the beginning the was in chaos."

But in the midst of the chaos we are also told, "...and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." Even in the chaos God's spirit was present. Let me say that again, EVEN IN THE CHAOS GOD'S SPIRIT WAS PRESENT.

No matter what kind of chaos we are experiencing, if we stop and acknowledge God's presence and listen for his voice, he will always move us through the chaos into his peace and his joy. Thanks be to God for that!

### **OUTREACH**

As I write this, Grace and Iglesia Vision Nueva have come together to provide 35 individual gifts to 8 families at Bridger and Vestal schools. These will be delivered the week before Christmas.

On Saturday, December 15, four of us drove up to Olympia for Sarah Nash's commissioning service. Sarah was supported by her pastor of 23 years, Rev. Mylinda, and Rev. Gary Bates, Rev. Sarah Strosahi Kagi, Rev. Jamie McCallum, Rev. Adalia Gutierrez Lee, MD. The Ceremony of Commissioning was led by Mercy Johnson.

Sarah is currently at 93% funding. Once she is at 100% she will attend her last training in February and will be on her way to Bolivia in March or early April. It has been wonderful to be a part of her pathway over the last year and a half. During 2018, Grace has met its goal of matching \$2000 of giving toward Sarah's support. Between the Sarah Nash fund budget, the match, and mission giving, Grace has provided \$5,109 toward her support.

International Ministries goes where the need is. Currently Ray Gutierrez is back in Tijuana Mexico working with partners to coordinate services for the families who are seeking asylum at our boarder. Please pray for Ray and also the many migrants that are stranded in Tijuana.
