Pastor Randy's Notes

SUMMARY OF APRIL 8 BOARD OF MINISTRIES MEETING

Attendance: Terri Becker, Ken Danielson, Barbara Furman, Carol Martin, Sharon Owen, Randy Pearson, Paul Young

Pastor -

One Cop Program – Pastor Randy has received the name of a police officer, but they have not yet met.

Neighbor to Neighbor – A representative from the church that started the program will speak to the Men's Breakfast on April 13. A big question is how to locate people that need help.

Gideons – The board agreed to host a speaker from the Gideons this year.

Bridger – Teacher Julia Collins called to say the 4th Grade Pancake Breakfast on April 6 netted over \$900- the greatest amount ever raised.

Combined services ideas:

Pastor Randy and Pastor Primo preach at alternate services

Hire a competent interpreter – it is expected to cost about \$100 per Sunday.

Hold a combined Sunday School program on joint service Sundays.

Concerns about the loudness of IVN music have led to Pastor Randy researching additions and changes to the sound system. Recommendations and expected costs are:

Electronic drums: \$1,700

Musicians' personal monitors: \$3,200 Musicians' earphones: \$40 each or \$400

Motion: That Grace Baptist pay up to \$6,000 from the undesignated portion of the Atkinson Fund for these upgrades to the sound system. (Sharon/Ken) It is hoped that IVN will be able to pay up to 50% of the costs, but Grace will pay the entire cost if needed. (Motion carried.)

Administration -

Windows – A Window World estimator has provided a verbal estimate of \$57,000 to repair and/or replace every exterior window in the building, except for the boiler room windows. Another company is expected to do a site visit this coming week.

Kitchen hot water tank – The tank is leaking and must be replaced, cost unknown.

Church Life -

Banner purchase – The purchase of new banners for the sanctuary will come from the Atkinson Fund (previously designated funds)

Interior décor suggestions – Paul reported on the visit by interior design consultant, Bruce Bridgess from FBC Portland.

Entryway – Replace the recycling box with a proper container; brighten with fresh color paint; change the bulletin boards covering and reduce the number; reduce clutter by removing the rolling cabinet, the old communion table/storage and extra chairs.

Sanctuary – Add banners to cover blank spaces (in process); change the piano position (done); re-cover the flooring in the area now missing linoleum in the back; store the stage cords better for unsightliness and safety; reduce superfluous items on the stage, i.e., extra plants, chairs and wooden screen.

Finance -

Grace rents a safety deposit box which is no longer needed, assuming we can access the safe.

Finance (cont.)-

Funds for Adult Missions – A new fund will be designated that includes support for all ages to attend mission activities and/or travel opportunities.

Rest Stop line item 1640 - 45% of the budget has already been spent. Barb said the higher expenses include purchase of a \$40 printer cartridge for the officers, snacks and coffee prices have increased, more officers are using the Rest Stop than in the past, donations of water by 7/11 stores has not been regular. We will try shopping on-line and in bulk.

2018 Financial Review Committee will be Nancy Brazda and Nancy Uhlinger.

Outreach -

Roddy Estrella attended the March mission trip meeting as liaison to IVN and wants to personally participate in the mission trip to Puerto Rico.

Communication with the American Baptist Home Mission Society regarding a mission trip to Puerto Rico- Any date is open and Outreach is considering February or March 2020.

Spiritual Life -

Focus – Terri attended a conference on persons with disabilities, both obvious and unseen. She learned that one of the problems is churches are not truly embracing and welcoming individuals due to their "differences" that put people off.
